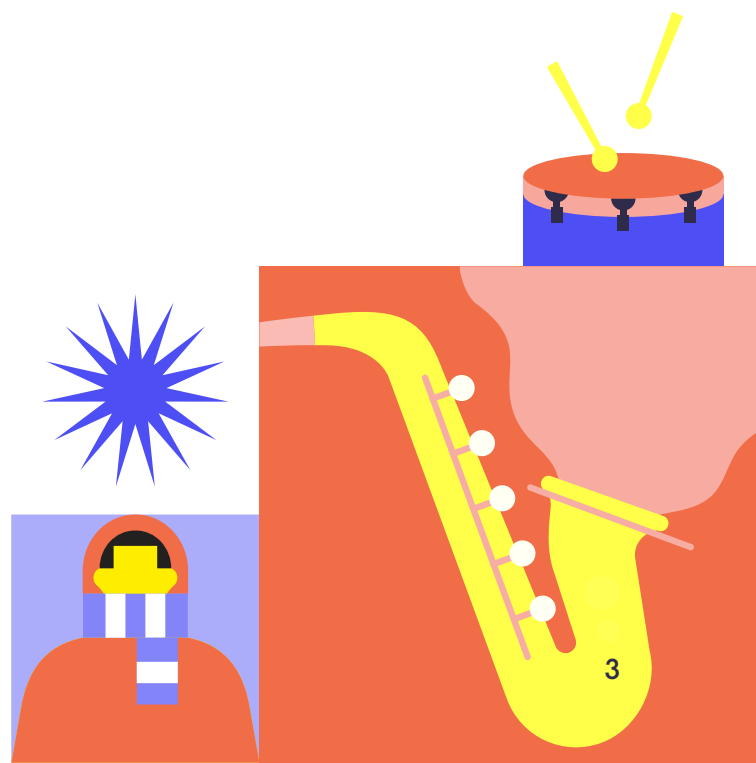

Rhythm, water and movement

Be enchanted by the rhythm and flow of water in this dynamic performance as these talented performers bring together music, movement and visual storytelling.

Through an engaging blend of percussion, soundscapes, and contemporary dance, students explore how rhythm and movement can reflect the natural world.

As the performers respond to each other in real time, students learn to listen deeply, interpret sound through movement, and express themselves through their own bodies. This highly immersive show encourages students to connect rhythm and motion, sparking new ways of thinking about music, dance and self-expression.

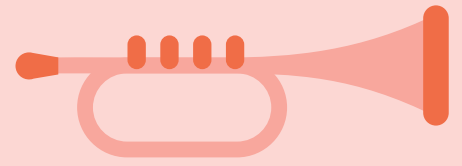

Music Education Residency Program

The Musica Viva Australia Music Education Residency Program focuses on individual schools, typically located in areas of socio-economic disadvantage. This three-year immersive program is designed to support the implementation of a comprehensive and effective music education program.

By providing select schools with a professional teaching artist, live music performances, tailored learning resources and instruments, the program supports schools to develop the skills and confidence to have agency over program delivery. Ongoing support and experiential learning is then provided through the Musica Viva Australia In Schools program including access to a portfolio of free professional development and education resources.

We work with primary schools to ensure that music education becomes an integral part of the school’s culture ensuring that generations of children receive the educational and intrinsic benefits of a quality music education.

In 2024, the program delivered 14 Music Education Residencies across Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne and Sydney — comprising 630 residency teaching days and engaging more than 3,200 students. We are proud to deliver quality music education programs to those who need it most, including culturally and linguistically diverse communities, as well as schools supporting students with additional access needs.

Professional Development

Musica Viva Australia's Education program provides teachers professional development opportunities to support their teaching of music education in Australian schools. Teachers can attend face-to-face and online workshops - many of them offered free of charge - that are designed for both general classroom and music specialist teachers across all states and territories.

All professional development workshops are curriculum aligned to the relevant State music syllabus and aligned to AITSL Professional Standards for Teachers.

Music Education Skills for the Primary Classroom course

Music Education Skills for the Primary Classroom is a 12-week online course that will build your skills and confidence in teaching music in the primary classroom.

Moderated and supervised by an experienced music educator, who will provide feedback and encouragement over 14 hours of learning, the course provides a general introduction to primary music education. Music Education Skills for the Primary Classroom is aimed at general classroom teachers with minimal music teaching experience who wish to build their skills and confidence in teaching music in the primary classroom. Participants will gain practical skills and creative ideas for use in their classroom.

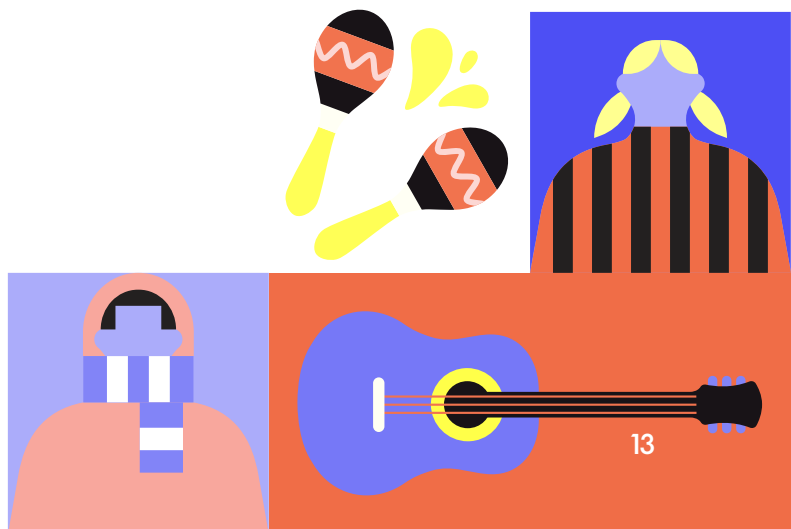
